1. PREAMBLE

The Conditions of Contest herein set forth are supplemental to the General Conditions of Contest for all Canadian National Bridge Championships, as issued by the Canadian Bridge Federation and together form the set of Rules and Regulations governing the 2025 CMTC, CNTC (flights A, B and C), CWTC, CSTC, COPC and CIPC.

Note particularly the following sections of the General Condition of Contest:

Section 4 - Eligibility and Conditions of Entry

Section 7 - Systems Policy

Section 17 - Eligibility to Represent Canada

In the event of any inconsistency between these Supplemental Conditions of Contest and the General Conditions of Contest, the Supplemental Conditions of Contest shall prevail.

If a situation arises that is not specifically covered in the Conditions of Contest (General or Supplemental) then the ACBL rules/guidelines shall apply.

2. DEFINITIONS

Expressions used in these Supplemental Conditions of Contest and not defined shall have their ordinary meaning in duplicate bridge terminology (which may include expressions defined in the Laws of Duplicate Bridge 2017). In the event of any doubt or dispute as to such meaning, the decision of the Championship Committee shall be final and conclusive. The singular shall include the plural and vice-versa and reference to one gender shall include the other.

Unless repugnant to the context or obvious meaning, all terms defined in the General Conditions of Contest shall have the same meaning for the purpose of these Supplemental Conditions of Contest and, in addition, the following expressions where used in these Supplemental Conditions of Contest shall have the following meanings:

Bermuda Bowl

means Open Teams competition at the World Bridge Teams Championships.

d'Orsi Seniors Trophy

means Seniors Teams competition at the World Bridge Teams Championships.

General Conditions of Contest

means the General Conditions of Contest issued by the CBF for the Canadian National Bridge Championships.

McConnell Cup

means transnational Women Teams competition at the World Bridge Series.

Rand Cup

means transnational Seniors Teams competition at the World Bridge Series.

Rosenblum Cup

means transnational Open Teams competition at the World Bridge Series.

Subsidy Pool

means the total financial subsidy budgeted by the CBF to support all the teams representing Canada at the World Bridge Championships

"these championships"

means the 2025 Canadian National Bridge Championships.

"these conditions of contest"

means the within Supplemental Conditions of Contest for the 2025 Canadian National Bridge Championships.

Venice Cup

means Women Teams competition at the World Bridge Teams Championships.

World Bridge Championships

means the annual world championships organized by the WBF.

World Bridge Games

means the World Bridge Championships held every four years, in the Summer Olympics year and includes the Vanderbilt Trophy (Open Teams), the Torlantino Trophy (Women Teams), the Seniors Teams, and the World Mixed Teams Championship.

World Bridge Series

means the World Bridge Championships held every four years, in the even-numbered non-Summer Olympic years (i.e., not leap years) and includes the Rosenblum Cup (Open Teams), McConnell Cup (Women's Teams), Rand Cup (Seniors Teams) and the World Transnational Mixed Teams.

World Bridge Teams Championships

means the World Bridge Championships held in odd-numbered years, and includes the Bermuda Bowl (Open Teams), Venice Cup (Women's Teams), d'Orsi Seniors Trophy (Seniors Teams), and the Wuhan Cup (Mixed Teams).

Zonal Playoff

means the playoff match against Mexico qualifying a team for the World Bridge Teams Championships.

3. DATE AND VENUE

The 2025 CBC will be held as follows:

- The round robin of the CSTC, CWTC, CMTc and CNTC-A will be played online on RealBridge:
 - CWTC – Saturday and Sunday, January 4/5, 2025
 - CMTc – Friday (if required) Saturday and Sunday, January 10*/11/12, 2025.
 - CNTC-A – Friday (if required) Saturday and Sunday, January 17*/18/19, 2025.
 - CSTC – Saturday and Sunday, February 1/2, 2025.

An asterisk * denotes the third day of RR if required.

- The round robin of the CNTC – B and C will be played online on BBO.
 - CNTC-B – Saturday and Sunday, January 25/26, 2025
 - CNTC-C – Saturday and Sunday, February 8/9, 2025
- The live championships will be April 14 to 20, 2025 in Toronto, On.
 - Sheraton Centre Toronto Hotel
 - 123 Queen St W, Toronto, On M5H 2M9

3.1. COVID REQUIREMENTS

Players attending in-person will be required to adhere to the vaccination and mask policy according to the provincial health policy and requirements in affect at the time of the event. Requirements will be posted on our website prior to the event.

4. DEADLINES FOR THE CHAMPIONSHIPS

4.1. TEAM PRE-REGISTRATION DEADLINE

Teams wishing to compete in any of the Canadian team championships must register, and pay the **non-refundable** Round Robin entry fee, no later than:

- Deadlines:
 - CWTC – November 30, 2024
 - CMTc – November 30, 2024
 - CNTC A, B & C – December 15, 2024
 - CSTC – December 15, 2024

4.2. PRE-ALERTS AND SYSTEMS DEADLINE

Pairs using a convention where a pre-alert is required must electronically submit a complete description of the convention (and a suggested defense if an approved defense is not included in the ACBL approved defenses database), no later than the Thursday of the week before the event starts.

- The ACBL Open+ Chart will apply for the CNTC A, CSTC, CWTC and CMTC
- The ACBL Open Chart will apply for the CNTC B and C.
- The ACBL Open Chart will apply for the COPC and CIPC.

4.3. ROSTER CHANGE AND SYSTEMS DEADLINE

- CNTC A December 31, 2024
- CNTC B December 31, 2024
- CNTC C December 31, 2024
- CWTC December 7, 2024
- CSTC January 7, 2024
- CMTC December 15, 2024

5. CLUB LEVEL AND CBF ONLINE QUALIFICATION

Club level qualification is required for the CNTC A, B and C and COPC. A person can qualify through the appropriate qualification game at their local club or can earn a qualifier in the CBF monthly online game held the 3rd Saturday of every month. The games held in October, November, and December of 2024 will grant qualifications. The CBF will offer on-line team qualifier games in October, November, and December 2024. Finishing in the top 50% or achieving a score of 50% or more will grant a qualification. To qualify for the CNTC A, B or COPC you must play in the Open game and the limited game will be a 999er game which will give CNTC C qualifications.

Any player registered for a Championship Team event will automatically be qualified for the COPC.

Since online qualifying games are being offered for the 2025 Championships, the discounted rate of \$25 for no local qualifiers is not being offered this year.

The travel subsidy will depend on the number of teams entered in the CNTC-A event and will be determined by the CBF Board of Directors.

The names of the winners of the CNTC-A are added to the Mark Molson Trophy.

Masterpoints awarded for this event may be different from what is specified in the ACBL Masterpoint Book due to the round robin being held on RealBridge.

The names of the winners of the CWTC are added to the Ruth Gold Memorial Trophy.

Masterpoints awarded for this event may be different from what is specified in the ACBL Masterpoint Book due to the round robin being held on RealBridge.

The travel subsidy will depend on the number of teams entered in the CMTC event and will be determined by the CBF Board of Directors.

11.4. MASTERPOINTS

Masterpoints awarded for this event may be different from what is specified in the ACBL Masterpoint Book due to the round robin being held on RealBridge.

12. COPC – Canadian Open Pairs Championship

12.3. PRIZES

Final prize money will depend on the number of entries in the COPC event.

13. CIPC – Canadian IMP Pairs Championship

13.1. SCHEDULE

This event has been suspended for 2025.

14. MISCELLANEOUS

14.1. THE SCHEDULE OF PLAY AND TIME SCHEDULE

The number and length of Round Robin matches in each team championship, are determined based on the number of teams registered. Accordingly, the schedule of matches and detailed time schedule will be published on the CBF website after the pre-registration deadline.

The quarter final, semi-final and final for CNTC A, B & C, CWTC, CSTC, CMTC events will be fifty-six boards played in four 14 board segments except for the CNTC A where the final will be played in eight 14 board segments for a total of 112 boards.

14.2. SUBSIDY POOL

See above for 2025 travel subsidies.

PRORATION OF SUBSIDY AND CASH PRIZES

In a team championship, the winning team's travel subsidy is based on a minimum of 14 teams participating in the event. Should fewer than 14 teams participate in the event, the subsidy shall be prorated accordingly.

14.3. SYSTEM NOTES

You are not allowed to refer to system notes during a match or event.

14.4. MINIMUM PARTICIPATION

A minimum of 2 teams are required to hold an event.

14.5. SUBSTITUTES

Substitutes are not allowed. However, if a team loses a player due to a sudden medical illness or death, they may replace that player. The replacement player should not be considered a stronger player than the original. The details of the situation and information about the proposed replacement should be forwarded to the Tournament Committee for consideration.

14.6. SCORING

Round Robin matches will be scored using the WBF Continuous 20-point scale. (Appendix A)

15. SPECIAL RULES FOR ONLINE PLAY ON REALBRIDGE

15.1 Video and Audio

A camera and microphone are required for play on RealBridge.

15.2. Realbridge Screenmate Communication

Screenmates (N & E, S & W) should do their best to have audio and video communication with each other throughout the bidding and play. During the play, a player may turn off video if they are having connection issues, but they must inform the director of their connection issues. When dummy, a player may leave the table.

15.3. Use of Electronic Devices

Other than a health-related device that has been approved by the Director in advance, no player may use an electronic device for any purpose other than playing on RealBridge. Headphones are permitted as well as a cell phone to communicate with the Director.

15.4. Undos for Misclicks

If a player misclicks on a bid, and it is an obvious misclick they may ask for an undo. The Director must be called to make the ruling. The request for an undo must be made before the partner of the person requesting the undo has acted.

15.5 Convention Cards and Alerts

Convention Cards must be provided to team-info@cbf.ca at least two weeks prior to your schedule event. Players should self-alert bids. The alert will be visible to both opponents. Further explanations should be made on each side of the screen to their screenmate. Players should explain any bid that they have information above and beyond what might be expected.

15.6 Additional requirements –

Additional requirements in terms of submitting lineups etc. will be communicated to players prior to the start of the event. If a player is late for a segment, there will be a 2-minute grace period and after that there will be a penalty of 1 VP per minute.

15.7 Duration of Matches

Time allowed for each round robin match will be announced when the schedule is announced. Time allotted will generally be based on 7.5 minutes per board. If a team is playing slowly, the Director should be notified. Penalties will be assigned according to the CBF Slow Play Regulations.

15.8 Interruption during Match Play

Every effort will be made to determine the cause of the problem (internet/power/sudden illness) and to correct the problem such that the player can get back on-line in a timely manner and complete the match. Telephone numbers for all players must be made available to the DIC prior to the beginning of the event.

If it is determined that the player is not able to get on-line or complete the match, corrective action will be taken in the following order:

- a. Substitute another team-mate from the same team to play with the existing on-line partner. (M/F requirements for the Mixed event remain in effect.)
- b. If at least 2/3 of the boards for the match have been played, then the match will be considered complete, and the match result will be based on the boards played.
- c. If the match interruption is not as a result of any action that could have been foreseen by any player (i.e. storm, power outage etc.) then at the sole discretion of the DIC the match may be determined by one of the following methods:
 1. Each team will be awarded an average of the VPs of the previous matches that they have played (a minimum of 5 matches must have been completed)
 2. The match may be rescheduled for another time during the event or within a few days following the event. (This may not occur if the DIC determines that neither team are in a position to qualify for the next round.)
- d. If the match interruption is deemed to be due to the negligence of any player (as determined by the DIC), then that player's team will be in default and the match will be forfeited. The team in forfeit shall score zero Victory Points and zero IMPs for the match. The team winning the forfeited match

will be awarded Victory Points per section 13. Forfeits In Team Events of the 2025 Conditions of Contest.

16. Special Rules for Online play on BBO

16.1. Use of Electronic Devices

Other than a health-related device that has been approved by the Director in advance, no player may use an electronic device for any purpose other than playing on BBO. Headphones are permitted as well as a cell phone to communicate with the Director.

16.2. Undos for Misclicks

If a player misclicks on a bid, and it is an obvious misclick they may ask for an undo. The Director must be called to make the ruling. The request for an undo must be made before the partner of the person requesting the undo has acted.

16.3. Convention Cards and Alerts

Convention Cards must be provided to team-info@cbf.ca at least two weeks prior to your schedule event. Players should self-alert bids. The alert will be visible to both opponents. Players should explain any bid that they have information above and beyond what might be expected.

16.4. Additional requirements –

Additional requirements in terms of submitting lineups etc. will be communicated to players prior to the start of the event. If a player is late for a segment, there will be a 2-minute grace period and after that there will be a penalty of 1 VP per minute.

16.5. Duration of Matches

Time allowed for each round robin match will be announced when the schedule is announced. Time allotted will generally be based on 7.5 minutes per board. If a team is playing slowly, the Director should be notified. Penalties will be assigned according to the CBF Slow Play Regulations.

16.6 Interruption during Match Play

Every effort will be made to determine the cause of the problem (internet/power/sudden illness) and to correct the problem such that the player can get back on-line in a timely manner and complete the match. Telephone numbers for all players must be made available to the DIC prior to the beginning of the event.

If it is determined that the player is not able to get on-line or complete the match, corrective action will be taken in the following order:

- e. Substitute another team-mate from the same team to play with the existing on-line partner. (M/F requirements for the Mixed event remain in effect.)
- f. If at least 2/3 of the boards for the match have been played, then the match will be considered complete, and the match result will be based on the boards played.
- g. If the match interruption is not as a result of any action that could have been foreseen by any player (i.e. storm, power outage etc.) then at the sole discretion of the DIC the match may be determined by one of the following methods:
 3. Each team will be awarded an average of the VPs of the previous matches that they have played (a minimum of 5 matches must have been completed)
 4. The match may be rescheduled for another time during the event or within a few days following the event. (This may not occur if the DIC determines that neither team are in a position to qualify for the next round.)
- h. If the match interruption is deemed to be due to the negligence of any player (as determined by the DIC), then that player's team will be in default and the match will be forfeited. The team in forfeit shall score zero Victory Points and zero IMPs for the match. The team winning the forfeited match will be awarded Victory Points per section 13. Forfeits In Team Events of the 2025 Conditions of Contest.
