SUPPLEMENTAL CONDITIONS OF CONTEST FOR THE 2026 CANADIAN NATIONAL BRIDGE CHAMPIONSHIPS

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1. PREAMBLE

The Conditions of Contest herein set forth are supplemental to the General Conditions of Contest for all Canadian National Bridge Championships, as issued by the Canadian Bridge Federation and together form the set of Rules and Regulations governing the 2026 CMTC, CNTC (flights A, B and C), CWTC, CSTC, COPC and CIPC.

Note particularly the following sections of the General Condition of Contest:

Section 4 - Eligibility and Conditions of Entry

Section 7 - Systems Policy

Section 17 - Eligibility to Represent Canada

In the event of any inconsistency between these Supplemental Conditions of Contest and the General Conditions of Contest, the Supplemental Conditions of Contest shall prevail.

If a situation arises that is not specifically covered in the Conditions of Contest (General or Supplemental) then the ACBL rules/guidelines shall apply.

2. DEFINITIONS

Expressions used in these Supplemental Conditions of Contest and not defined shall have their ordinary meaning in duplicate bridge terminology (which may include expressions defined in the Laws of Duplicate Bridge 2017). In the event of any doubt or dispute as to such meaning, the decision of the Championship Committee shall be final and conclusive. The singular shall include the plural and vice-versa and reference to one gender shall include the other.

Unless repugnant to the context or obvious meaning, all terms defined in the General Conditions of Contest shall have the same meaning for the purpose of these Supplemental Conditions of Contest and, in addition, the following expressions where used in these Supplemental Conditions of Contest shall have the following meanings:

Bermuda Bowl

means Open Teams competition at the World Bridge Teams Championships.

d'Orsi Seniors Trophy

means Seniors Teams competition at the World Bridge Team Championships.

General Conditions of Contest

means the General Conditions of Contest issued by the CBF for the Canadian National Bridge Championships.

McConnell Cup

means transnational Women Teams competition at the World Bridge Series.

Rand Cup

means transnational Seniors Teams competition at the World Bridge Series.

Rosenblum Cup

means transnational Open Teams competition at the World Bridge Series.

Subsidy Pool

means the total financial subsidy budgeted by the CBF to support all the teams representing Canada at the World Bridge Championships

"these championships"

means the 2026 Canadian National Bridge Championships.

"these conditions of contest"

means the within Supplemental Conditions of Contest for the 2026 Canadian National Bridge Championships.

Venice Cup

means Women Teams competition at the World Bridge Teams Championships.

World Bridge Championships

means the annual world championships organized by the WBF.

World Bridge Games

means the World Bridge Championships held every four years, in the Summer Olympics year and includes the Vanderbilt Trophy (Open Teams), the Torlontano Trophy (Women Teams), the Seniors Teams, the World Mixed Teams Championship as well as pair events for Open, Senior, Women & Mixed categories.

World Bridge Series means the World Bridge Championships held every four years, in the even-numbered non-Summer Olympic years (i.e., not leap years) and includes the Rosenblum Cup (Open Teams), McConnell Cup (Women's Teams), Rand Cup (Seniors Teams), the World Transnational Mixed Teams as well as pair events for Open, Senior, Women & Mixed categories.

World Bridge Teams Championships means the World Bridge Championships held in odd-numbered years, and includes the Bermuda Bowl (Open Teams), Venice Cup (Women's Teams), d'Orsi Seniors Trophy (Seniors Teams), and the Wuhan Cup (Mixed Teams).

Wuhan Cup

means Mixed Teams competition at the World Bridge Teams Championships.

Zonal Playoff

means the playoff match against Mexico qualifying a team for the World Bridge Teams Championships.

3. DATE AND VENUE

The 2026 CBC will be held as follows:

- The round robin of the CSTC, CWTC, CMTC and CNTC-A will be played online on RealBridge:
- All events will occur on Friday*, Saturday and Sunday. An asterisk* denotes the third day if required.
 - CWTC – Jan. 16*, 17, 18
 - CMTC – Jan. 9*, 10, 11
 - CNTC-A – Jan. 23*, 24, 25
 - CSTC – Jan. 30*, 31 Feb. 1
- The round robin of the CNTC – B and C will be played online on RealBridge, such round robin being played only if at least 5 teams enter. With 4 or fewer teams, there will be no qualifying sessions,
 - CNTC-B – Saturday and Sunday, January 31/Feb 1, 2026
 - CNTC-C – Saturday and Sunday, January 17/18, 2026
- The Knockout stage for all competitions will be played live from June 15 to 21 2026 in Penticton, BC.

4. DEADLINES FOR THE CHAMPIONSHIPS

4.1. TEAM PRE-REGISTRATION DEADLINE

Teams wishing to compete in any of the Canadian team championships must register, and pay the **nonrefundable** Round Robin entry fee, no later than:

- Deadlines:
 - CWTC – November 30, 2025
 - CMTC – November 30, 2025
 - CNTC A & C – December 15, 2025
 - CSTC, CNTC B – December 30, 2025

4.2. PRE-ALERTS AND SYSTEMS DEADLINE

Pairs using a convention where a pre-alert is required must electronically submit a complete description of the convention (and a suggested defense if an approved defense is not included in the ACBL approved Defense Database), no later than the Thursday of the week before the event starts.

4.3. ROSTER CHANGE AND SYSTEMS DEADLINE

CNTC A, B & C, CMTC CWTC December 31, 2025

CSTC January 7, 2026

5. CLUB LEVEL AND CBF ONLINE QUALIFICATION

Club level qualification is required for **ALL Canadian Championship events**. (CNTC-A, CMTC, CWTC, CSTC). You earn a qualification as an individual by finishing in the top 50% of your field or achieving a score of 50% or more. (Winning 50% of your matches in a team game.) A person can qualify through the appropriate qualification game (pairs or team) at their local club held between September and December 2025 or can earn a qualifier in the CBF online games. The CBF will offer both on-line team qualifier games and pair games in October, November, and December 2025. To qualify for any of the Championship Events or the COPC you must play in an Open game.

Any player registered for a Championship Team event will not automatically be qualified for the COPC. COPC qualification is required.

Club level qualification is not required for CNTC-B and CNTC-C events.

Since online qualifying games are being offered for the 2026 Championships, the following discounted rates will apply. All qualifying fees collected are directed to the CBC International Fund.

6. CNTC-A

6.1. SCHEDULE

Quarter Final	June 15, 2026	60 Boards
Semi Final	June 16, 2026	60 Boards
Final	June 17 & 18, 2026	120 Boards

The CNTC A Round Robin will be played over 3 days if more than 12 teams registered.

Provided that should 16 or more teams register, the Championship Committee may divide the field into 2 seeded groups, with the top 4 teams from each group advancing to the knockout stage.

The CNTC-A Quarter final and Semi final will be 60 boards in 2026.

The CNTC-A Final will be 120 boards over two days in 2026.

6.2. ENTRY FEE

Round Robin	\$280/day
KO Stage	\$360/day

6.3. WINNING TEAM

Subject to meeting the eligibility to represent Canada requirements, the winning team will be invited to represent Canada in the Rosenblum Cup at the 2026 World Bridge Series and shall receive a subsidy of the entry fee.

6.4. MASTERPOINTS

Masterpoints awarded for this event may be different from what is specified in the ACBL Masterpoint Book due to the round robin being held online.

7. CNTC-B

7.1. SCHEDULE

7.2. ENTRY FEE

Round Robin	\$220/day
Semi Final	\$260

7.3. WINNING TEAM

The winning team will receive a cash prize to be determined by the number of entries, but in any event will be no less than \$500.

7.4. MASTERPOINTS

Masterpoints awarded for this event may be different from what is specified in the ACBL Masterpoint Book due to the round robin being held online.

8. CNTC-C

8.1. SCHEDULE

8.2. ENTRY FEE

Round Robin	\$160/day
Semi Final	\$200
Final	\$200

8.3. WINNING TEAM

The winning team will receive a cash prize to be determined by the number of entries, but in any event, it will be no less than \$300.

8.4. MASTERPOINTS

Masterpoints awarded for this event may be different from what is specified in the ACBL Masterpoint Book due to the round robin being held online.

9. CWTC

9.1. SCHEDULE

Round Robin	Online on RealBridge	January 16*/17/18 2026
Quarter Final	June 16, 2026 (If necessary)	60 Boards
Semi Final	June 17, 2026	60 Boards
Final	June 18, 2026	60 Boards

The CWTC Round Robin will be played over 3 days if more than 12 teams registered. As with the CNTC-A, should more than 15 teams register, the Championship Committee may divide the field into 2 seeded groups, with the top 4 teams from each group advancing to the knockout stage.

The CWTC Quarter final, semi final and final will be 60 boards in 2026.

There will be a round-robin only if at least 5 teams register.

9.2. ENTRY FEE

Round Robin	\$280/day
KO Stage	\$360/day

9.3. WINNING TEAM

Subject to meeting the eligibility to represent Canada requirements, the winning team will be invited to represent Canada in the McConnell Cup at the 2026 World Bridge Series and shall receive a subsidy of the entry fee.

9.4. MASTERPOINTS

Masterpoints awarded for this event may be different from what is specified in the ACBL Masterpoint Book due to the round robin being held online.

10. CSTC

10.1. ELIGIBILITY

To participate in a Senior event part of the WBF Championships, the player must reach at least the required minimum age specified in the WBF Eligibility Code. This is set to 65 as of January 1st, 2026.

10.2. SCHEDULE

The CSTC Round Robin will be played over 3 days if more than 12 teams registered.

The CSTC Quarter final, semi final and final will be 60 boards in 2026.

10.3. ENTRY FEE

Round Robin	\$280/day
KO Stage	\$360/day

10.4. WINNING TEAM

Subject to meeting the eligibility to represent Canada requirements, the winning team will be invited to represent Canada in the Rand Cup at the 2026 World Bridge Series and shall receive a subsidy of the entry fee.

10.5. MASTERPOINTS

Masterpoints awarded for this event may be different from what is specified in the ACBL Masterpoint Book due to the round robin being held online.

11. CMTC

11.1. SCHEDULE

Round Robin	Online on RealBridge	Jan 9*/10/11 2026
Quarter Final	19 June 2026 (If necessary)	60 Boards
Semi Final	20 June 2026	60 Boards
Final	21 June 2026	60 Boards

The CMTC Round Robin will be played over 3 days if more than 12 teams registered.

The CMTC Quarter final, semi final and final will be 60 boards in 2026.

11.2. ENTRY FEE

Round Robin	\$280/day
KO Stage	\$360/day

11.3. WINNING TEAM

Subject to meeting the eligibility to represent Canada requirements, the winning team will be invited to represent Canada in the World Transnational Mixed Teams at the 2026 World Bridge Series and shall receive a subsidy of the entry fee.

11.4. MASTERPOINTS

Masterpoints awarded for this event may be different from what is specified in the ACBL Masterpoint Book due to the round robin being held online.

12. COPC – Canadian Open Pairs Championship

12.1. SCHEDULE

This event will be moving to RealBridge. Dates TBD

12.2. ENTRY FEE

\$30 Canadian per person per session.

12.3. PRIZES

1 st Place	The winning pair gets Jim Donaldson Trophy and at least \$500.
2 nd Place	2 nd place pair receives \$250.

Final prize money will depend on the number of entries in the COPC event.

13. CIPC – Canadian IMP Pairs Championship

13.1. SCHEDULE

This event has been suspended for 2026.

14. MISCELLANEOUS

14.1. THE SCHEDULE OF PLAY AND TIME SCHEDULE

The number and length of Round Robin matches in each team championship, are determined based on the number of teams registered. Accordingly, the schedule of matches and detailed time schedule will be published on the CBF website after the pre-registration deadline.

The quarter final, semi-final and final for CNTC A, CWTC, CSTC, CMTC events will be sixty boards played in four 15 board segments except for the CNTC A where the final will be played in eight 15 board segments for a total of 120 boards.

The semi-final and final for CNTC B & C, events will be fifty-six boards played in four 14 board segments.

14.2. SUBSIDY POOL

Winning teams for CNTC A, CWTC, CSTC, CMTC events, will be invited to represent Canada in the 2026 World Bridge Series in their respective category. Subsidy will be limited to the entry fee for the event and substitution rules from the CBF policies will apply. Only the winning team will qualify for subsidy.

14.3. SYSTEM NOTES

You are not allowed to refer to system notes during a match or event.

14.4. MINIMUM PARTICIPATION

A minimum of 2 teams is required to hold an event.

14.5. SCORING

Round Robin matches will be scored using the WBF Continuous 20-point scale. (Appendix A)

15. SPECIAL RULES FOR ONLINE PLAY ON REALBRIDGE

15.1 Video and Audio

A camera and microphone are required for play on RealBridge.

15.2. RealBridge Screen mate Communication

Screen mates (N & E, S & W) should do their best to have audio and video communication with each other throughout the bidding and play. During the play, a player may turn off video if they are having connection issues, but they must inform the director of their connection issues. When dummy, a player may leave the table.

15.3. Use of Electronic Devices

Other than a health-related device that has been approved by the Director in advance, no player may use an electronic device for any purpose other than playing on RealBridge. Headphones are permitted as well as a cell phone to communicate with the Director.

15.4. Undos for Misclicks

If a player misclicks on a bid, and it is an obvious misclick they may ask for an undo. The Director must be called to make the ruling. The request for an undo must be made before the partner of the person requesting the undo has acted.

15.5 Convention Cards and Alerts

Convention Cards must be provided to team-info@cbf.ca at least two weeks prior to your schedule event. Players should self-alert bids. The alert will be visible to both opponents. Further explanations should be made on each side of the screen to their screen mate. Players should explain any bid that they have information above and beyond what might be expected.

15.6 Additional requirements

Additional requirements in terms of submitting lineups etc. will be communicated to players prior to the start of the event

15.7 Duration of Matches

Time allowed for each round robin match will be announced when the schedule is announced. Time allotted will generally be based on 7.5 minutes per board. If a team is playing slowly, the Director should be notified. Penalties will be assigned according to the CBF Slow Play Regulations.

15.8 Interruption during Match Play

Every effort will be made to determine the cause of the problem (internet/power/sudden illness) and to correct the problem such that the player can get back on-line in a timely manner and complete the match. Telephone numbers for all players must be made available to the DIC prior to the beginning of the event.

If it is determined that the player is not able to get on-line or complete the match, corrective action will be taken in the following order:

- a. Substitute another team-mate from the same team to play with the existing on-line partner. (M/F requirements for the Mixed event remain in effect.)
- b. If at least 2/3 of the boards for the match have been played, then the match will be considered complete, and the match result will be based on the boards played.
- c. If the match interruption is not as a result of any action that could have been foreseen by any player (i.e. storm, power outage etc.) then at the sole discretion of the DIC the match may be determined by one of the following methods:
 1. Each team will be awarded an average of the VPs of the previous matches that they have played (a minimum of 5 matches must have been completed).
 2. The match may be rescheduled for another time during the event or within a few days following the event. (This may not occur if the DIC determines that neither team are in a position to qualify for the next round.)
- d. If the match interruption is deemed to be due to the negligence of any player (as determined by the DIC), then that player's team will be in default, and the match will be forfeited. The team in forfeit shall score zero Victory Points and zero IMPs for the match. The team winning the forfeited match will be awarded Victory Points per section 13. Forfeits In Team Events of the 2025 Conditions of Contest.

16. Special Rules for Online play on BBO

16.1. Use of Electronic Devices

Other than a health-related device that has been approved by the Director in advance, no player may use an electronic device for any purpose other than playing on BBO. Headphones are permitted as well as a cell phone to communicate with the Director.

16.2. Undos for Misclicks

If a player misclicks on a bid, and it is an obvious misclick they may ask for an undo. The Director must be called to make the ruling. The request for an undo must be made before the partner of the person requesting the undo has acted.

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- a. Substitute another team-mate from the same team to play with the existing on-line partner. (M/F requirements for the Mixed event remain in effect.)
- b. If at least 2/3 of the boards for the match have been played, then the match will be considered complete, and the match result will be based on the boards played.

- c. If the match interruption is not as a result of any action that could have been foreseen by any player (i.e. storm, power outage etc.) then at the sole discretion of the DIC the match may be determined by one of the following methods:
 - 1. Each team will be awarded an average of the VPs of the previous matches that they have played (a minimum of 5 matches must have been completed).
 - 2. The match may be rescheduled for another time during the event or within a few days following the event. (This may not occur if the DIC determines that neither team are in a position to qualify for the next round.)
- d. If the match interruption is deemed to be due to the negligence of any player (as determined by the DIC), then that player's team will be in default, and the match will be forfeited. The team in forfeit shall score zero Victory Points and zero IMPs for the match. The team winning the forfeited match will be awarded Victory Points per section 13. Forfeits In Team Events of the 2025 Conditions of Contest.
