4. FINANCIAL STATEMENTS -

Catherine Kinsella spoke to the Financial Statements which were distributed to attendees.

- 2023 had Significant losses (declining revenue, rising costs)
 - (\$79,940) split between Gen. Fund (\$46,410) and International Fund (\$33,530)
- Re-allocation of funds from Junior and International to General Fund. (repayment)
- As per our last AGM we have moved our investments into GICs to reduce volatility and increase/stabilize returns.
- Revenue Membership numbers have decreased during COVID. We have approx. 3900 members vs. The ACBL having 16,000 members in Canada.
- 2024 Membership drive supported by ACBL/NABC Maple Leaf promotion.
- New Canadian Championship Model partnership with existing Regionals (reduce risk)

Discussion -

General Concern with the loss but an understanding of the rebuilding required coming out of the pandemic. Need to increase membership and find more cost-effective ways to run CBF events that derisk our exposure to losses and provide revenue streams to fund our organization.

Barry Senensky – Wanted to discuss and understand our rationale for moving away from a stand-alone Canadian Championship/Regional and moving to our current model of partnering with existing, established regionals across the country.

- Significant loss for the 2023 Canadian Championships resulted in the CBF drawing on reserves to fund international registration fees/travel. (\$33,530)
- The current landscape for F2F Bridge tournaments is still at 60% of pre-pandemic levels.
- Significant work and risk/cost are involved in securing sites and running a Regional Event in parallel to the Canadian Championship.
- Current model minimizes the CBF risk and allows the CBF to partner with existing, well-established Regionals across the country.
