

MINUTES of the Meeting of the Trustees of the Canadian Bridge Federation Charitable Fund held at the Sandman Hotel, Penticton, BC on Saturday, May 31, 2003.

1.0 CALL TO ORDER

4.2 ACBL Charges & Payments

Jan reported that in 2002, the ACBL charged us \$6,173.88 for our 10% share of expenses. This is down about \$2,400.00 from the charges in 2001. The decrease in charges was due to the ACBL reducing the fee for a staff member from \$24,000.00 US to \$12,000.00 US and to the strengthening of the Canadian dollar so that the exchange was less.

Marilyn White commented that "third-party presentations", though they sound like a good idea in theory, rarely work out well. Something always seems to go wrong. Marilyn hoped that in the future we try to avoid them.

4.3 Other Business arising from the Minutes

No other business was brought forward at this time.

5.0 FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

5.1 2002 Audited Financial Statement

MOTION: 2002 audited statement received and accepted.

MOVED by Jim Priebe.

SECONDED by Doug Fraser.

CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.

The Trustees expressed concerns about the limited funds we have available for donating to Canadian Charities. It was felt that we should again write to the ACBL Charity Foundation expressing our concerns about the high charges. The percentage that goes to administrative costs is just too high and does not meet with acceptable standards.

It was also felt that we should check with the ACBL organization about Canada getting a share of Charity funds raised during the NABC Charity Day.

Janice Anderson and Marilyn White will look after contacting the ACBL Charity Foundation.

6.0 2003 CHARITIES

6.1 Designated Charities and other Requests

At our 2002 meeting we designated the following charities.

a) Organizations that deal with Child Poverty.

Marilyn White reported on her research into these organizations.

- Canadian Feed the Children Domestic Program all money donated to it stays in Canada
- Campaign Against Child Poverty
- Daily Bread Food Bank
- Campaign 2000

Marilyn also provided the Trustees with internet links that may be helpful in finding organizations specifically working in their areas.

b) Other charity requests received during the year:

Canadian Guide Dogs for the Blind - no amount specified

Hospice of Peel - no amount specified

Humane Society of Canada - no amount specified - but requested support for critical care needs of Canadian farm animals who are suffering due to severe drought that hit the prairies in 2002.

Canadian Institute for the Blind Amateur Radio Program - no amount specified.

Covenant House Vancouver - requested \$4,000 to provide one full year of programs for one of the 1,375 young people it will assist in the coming year.

Frontier College - no amount specified but they are looking for support for their Beat the Street Program.

Vancouver "Loving Spoonful" - requested \$1000 for a display board.

Marilyn suggested that in looking at our Focal Group of Child Poverty there are two levels that we can donate to:

- 1. Organizations that give direct support to children
- 2. Organizations that deal on a higher level advocacy groups

Keeping this in mind Marilyn recommended:

- 1. Canadian Feed the Children Domestic Program for giving to a group that gives direct support to children
- 2. Campaign 2000 Report Card for an advocacy group that gets lots of publicity and puts a lot of pressure on other agencies to try and eliminate child hunger in Canada.

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The 2003 Budget was gone over.

7.0 2004 DESIGNATED CHARITIES

Marilyn suggested "Hospice and Palliative Care Facilities" as possible Focal Group for 2004.

After discussion by the Trustees it was decided that keeping the same focal group for 2 or 3 years would enable the CBFCF to do more for each area. This way Trustees could support more organizations in their area that deal with the focal group if they know that they can give to this area over a longer period of time.

MOTION: For 2004 the CBFCF Designated Charity will include, but not be limited to, organizations that deal with Child Poverty.

MOVED by Jim Priebe. SECONDED by Doug Heron. CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY. Janice Anderson reminded the Trustees of the Revenue Canada rules for "Qualified Donaors" and the CBFCF Guidelines for Charitable Fund Applications.

8.0 OTHER BUSINESS

8.1 Acknowledgement of Chairperson

MOTION: The CBFCF Board of Trustees formally acknowledges the importance of all the work that Chairperson, Marilyn White does for the Fund. Thank you Marilyn.

Discussion took place about what is a reasonable amount to charge the Charity Fund for the expenses of this meeting. It was noted that Marilyn's expenses will be much higher this year since the meeting was not held in Toronto.
