COMPLAINT PROCEDURES

1. CONDUCT, DISCIPLINE, ETHICS & REGULATIONS

A (any) person may report any of the following concerns:

- (a) An issue on a bridge hand: an irregularity, a problem in the bidding or play, possibly for a score adjustment to → Director (of tourney)
- (b) Possible conduct infraction, at or away from the table, or questionable or suspicious actions at the table to \rightarrow Recorder
- (c) Serious conduct infraction, at or away from the table, or clear wrongdoing at or away from the table to → "Charging party" (At an in person CBC Director, not at an in person CBC President of CBF)

(a) Bridge hand issue, irregularity, bidding or play issue, and/or score adjustment, Zero Tolerance Complaint → Director (of tourney)

- i) Director issues ruling.
- ii) Director ruling appealed or in the situation where there is no Director, such as an online event, to → Tournament Rulings Committee ("TRC" committee of players); in the case of a Zero Tolerance complaint, where a Director is not present, to → Tournament Co-ordinator ("TC").
- iii) Director or TC coordinates appointment of TRC (ad hoc amongst participating players).
- iv) TRC outcome, whether the score stands, or an adjustment to the score is made, with or without penalty for frivolous appeal, is final.

(b) Possible conduct infraction, at or away from table, or questionable or suspicious action at the table to \rightarrow Recorder

When Recorder determines that there are sufficient complaints to warrant further investigation, the complaints will be forwarded by Recorder to the "Charging party", namely the President or, in the event of a conflict, to the "Charging party", namely the Vice-President.

(c) Serious conduct infraction, at or away from the table, or clear wrongdoing at or away from the table to → "Charging party" (at an in-person CBC, Director, or otherwise, President or Vice-President).

Incidents that do not take place at an in-person CBC to \rightarrow Recorder

- i) Recorder looks into case.
- ii) In the event that the issue is a matter only of record, Recorder files case away.
- iii) In the event that the issue, cumulatively or individually, is a matter of public reckoning (serious), Recorder elevates case to the "Charging party" (President or Vice-President).
- iv) Recorder is (becomes) complainant; and complainant of origin pursues as a witness.
- iv) "Charging party" (President or Vice-President) determines whether:
 - There is "prima facie" evidence of an offense;
 - Such is sanctionable (upon guilty determination); and
 - CBF has jurisdiction.
- v) "Charging party" (President or Vice-President) channels affirmative determination to Disciplinary Committee ("DC"), (former Ethics Committee) or, if sufficient evidence does not exist, files case away (informing Recorder).

Incidents that take place during an in-person (i.e. not online) CBC to \rightarrow Director

The Director in charge (DIC) is the "Charging party":

- The "Charging party" will decide as described in paragraph 7.3.2 of the Disciplinary Guidelines whether to bring charges, and have the Tournament Disciplinary Committee hear the case.
- ii) Complaint and resolution are reported to \rightarrow Recorder.

The accused party may appeal the decision of the Disciplinary Committee to \rightarrow Appeals Committee ("AC"), where AC decision is final.
